Youth 13 – 16 years

1. Cookies, any variety – 4
2. Cake, any flavour, decorated to celebrate the Airdrie Centennial
3. Largest vegetable
4. Funniest looking vegetable

Adult – 17 and older

1. Cake, any flavour, decorated to celebrate the Airdrie Centennial
2. Fruit pie, any variety, pastry crust
3. Canning
 - a. Any fruit, no pectin – 1 jar
 - b. Any fruit, pectin – 1 jar
4. Jam
 - a. Any fruit, no pectin - 1 jar
 - b. Any fruit, pectin – 1 jar
5. Pickles
 - a. Bread & butter
 - b. Dill
 - c. Other

General Rules

1. Exhibits must be submitted between 4:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. on Friday, September 11, 2009 at Nose Creek Park.
2. Official entry tags must be used on all exhibits and will be available at time of registration
3. Only entries listed will be accepted for competition.
4. Entries will be judged the evening of Friday, September 11 and the morning of Saturday, September 12, 2009.
5. Exhibits will be displayed during the Old Time Fair in Nose Creek Park on Saturday, September 12, 2009.
6. All exhibits must be collected between 6:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. on Saturday, September 12, 2009.
7. All entries remain the property of the exhibitor. Any entries remaining after the show will be disposed of at the discretion of the Airdrie & District Fall Fair Committee.
8. The Airdrie & District Fall Fair Committee and Airdrie & District Agricultural Society will not be responsible for damage to or theft of entries and/or displays.

History of the Airdrie & District Fall Fair

The Airdrie & District Fall Fair started as the Nose Creek Community Club Fair in 1963. The N.C.C.C. Fair was organized by the Nose Creek Community Club and was originally held at the Balzac Hall. Over the years, the Fair moved to several locations within Airdrie and is currently held at the Plainsmen Arena, its original home in Airdrie.

Some of the original Fair classes included hay, grain and vegetables – things that were a part of everyday rural life. Other classes included baking, home canning and handicrafts. Many of the original classes remain the same; the items within them have changed to reflect our changing society.

The Airdrie & District Agricultural Society sponsored the Fall Fair for many years and in 2003 the name was officially changed to the Airdrie & District Fall Fair. The Fall Fair is held the 3rd weekend of August each year and is a great opportunity to stay connected with our heritage and rural roots.
